# BASE INRW Integrated Reading and Writing (BASE INRW 0373)

#### Credit

3 semester credit hours (3 hours lecture)

### Prerequisite/Co-requisite

Students not TSI complete and scoring a 3-6 ABE score are required to enroll in this course.

Students scoring a 3 or 4 ABE are required to be co-enrolled in INRW 0173.

#### **Course Description**

Integration of critical reading and academic writing skills. This course does not fulfill TSI requirements for reading and/or writing.

### **Course Objectives**

Upon completion of this course, the student will be able to:

- 1. Locate explicit textual information, draw complex inferences, and describe, analyze, and evaluate the information within and across multiple texts of varying lengths.
- 2. Comprehend and use vocabulary effectively in oral communication, reading, and writing.
- 3. Identify and analyze the audience, purpose, and message across a variety of texts.
- 4. Describe and apply insights gained from reading and writing a variety of texts.
- 5. Compose a variety of texts that demonstrate reading comprehension, clear focus, logical development of ideas, and use of appropriate language that advance the writer's purpose.
- 6. Determine and use effective approaches and rhetorical strategies for given reading and writing situations.
- 7. Generate ideas and gather information relevant to the topic and purpose, incorporating the ideas and words of other writers in student writing using established strategies.
- 8. Evaluate relevance and quality of ideas and information in recognizing, formulating, and developing a claim.
- 9. Develop and use effective reading and revision strategies to strengthen the writer's ability to compose college-level writing assignments.
- 10. Recognize and apply the conventions of Standard English in reading and writing.

- 2. Communication Skills: To include effective development, interpretation and expression of ideas through written, oral and visual communication.
