POLICY LIT.1.02 AUTHORITY, DUTIES, AND RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE PRESIDENT

SCOPE: Faculty, Staff, and Students

- 1. The President is the chief executive officer of the College and is appointed by The Texas State University System (TSUS) Board of Regents upon recommendation from the Chancellor.
- 2. Texas State University System Rules and Regulations, Chapter IV, Section 2, establishes the authorities, duties, and responsibilities of the President.
 - 2.1. "The President shall be answerable to the Chancellor and shall have discretionary powers broad enough effectively to administer the Component with the policies and guidelines as set forth by the Chancellor and Board of Regents."
- 3. In order to efficiently and effectively administer the College, the President may delegate authority as deemed appropriate and necessary unless specifically prohibited by TSUS Rules and Regulations or Texas Statutes.
