Program Information

The Apple Entrepreneurship Program is a Dual Credit Pathway that is offered in partnership with Apple to teach students both the entrepreneurship and app development skills needed to successfully create and market a functional Apple App. Students would need to complete the Principles of Business high school course as a prerequisite for entry into this program. The program begins the summer before the student's senior year. The summer course and senior practicum courses are all dual enrolled courses. Students completing this course will receive 12 hours of college credit at LIT. This program satisfies the Entrepreneurship Program of Study (highlighted in green).
